PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT PLAN 2015-2016

To support the belief of Bradford High School, the schools' alumni, and community must work together as knowledgeable partners. The Bradford High School Parental Involvement Plan will include, but not be limited to, the following items of a successful parental involvement plan:

- A. Bradford High School will provide opportunities to involve parents, alumni, and community.
 - 1. A Parental Involvement Plan will be developed by a committee made up of interested parents and the Parent Coordinator. (Leslie Dunn- District Parent Coordinator, Renee Barron- Parent, Phyllis Boyce –Grandparent, Crystal Yates – Parent)
 - 2. The plan will be disseminated to all district patrons at Open House or the first Parent/Teacher Conferences. (Principal- Rick Wood)
 - 3. Parents will participate on site-based committees, such as school improvement, literacy, and math. (Debbie Turner- Grandparent, Star Mason-Parent, Jeannie Bright –Parent)
 - 4. A needs assessment will be conducted at the building level to determine degree of needs. The list of needs will be compiled and distributed to parents. (Sabrina Otts-Counselor)
 - 5. Parents will be surveyed regarding their abilities and interests as volunteers provided in the informational packets. Staff will be encouraged to use the surveys. (Leslie Dunn- District Parent Coordinator)
 - 6. Parent volunteers will participate in the development and implementation of the Parental Involvement Plan. (Leslie Dunn- District Parent Coordinator, Renee Barron- Parent, Phyllis Boyce –Grandparent, Crystal Yates –Parent)
 - 7. Information about student performance activities such as plays, concerts, and athletic events will be provided for parents so that parents will have the opportunity to attend the activities. (Principal Rick Wood)
- B. Parent kits containing pertinent school information will be furnished to each parent. Each kit will contain the following:
 - 1. School/district calendar
 - 2. Description of school's Parent Involvement Program
 - 3. Contact information for parents about each school
 - 4. Location of helpful parent materials
 - 5. Hours and location of parent center
 - 6. Recommended role of the parent, student, teacher, and school
 - 7. School telephone number, e-mail address, and school web-page address
 - 8. Dates of two parent/teacher conferences to be held each year
 - 9. Guidelines and procedures for parent visitation

C. Activities and Events

1. Orientation for Grade 6 students will be held. They will be shown where their classes will be held, and, if possible, meet all their teachers.
2. Financial Aid/Career/College Night will be scheduled to assist students and parents in program planning and in obtaining financial aid for post-secondary education. The High School Counselor plans to have this seminar for seniors in late January 2016 or early February 2016. A seminar for students in Grades 9-11 is planned in April or May 2016. The counselor will assist students and parents in selecting a course of study to complete graduation requirements.
3. Two parent/teacher conferences have been scheduled
 1. The first one is scheduled for September 23, 2015, from 2:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
 2. The second one is scheduled for February 11, 2016 from 2:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

D. School Policies

1. Guidelines for parent visitation are available in the high school office.
2. Teachers and administrators are required to earn staff development hours in effective parental involvement strategies: 2 hours for teachers and 3 hours for administrators.
